Imaginative Prayer

Do you ever imagine yourself present in a Gospel story? Have you ever thought about what you would have said or done if you were there? Do you ever wonder what those first days and weeks after the Resurrection were like?

One form of prayer is imaginative prayer. You begin by reading a passage from scripture slowly, deliberately, paying

attention to the details. You may read it a second time. Then, close your eyes and replay the story in your mind, *imagining* yourself present as a bystander or particular character.

Think about the events of Holy Week and immediately following Easter ...

Imagine seeing your friend, teacher and Savior arrested, beaten and brutally killed on Good Friday. Despite being told what would happen, they still did not understand. What were the Apostles thinking?

Imagine the fear, guilt, anger, and sadness they must have felt. How did they process these emotions?

Imagine, the worry and panic upon learning that the tomb was empty. Mary Magdalene told Peter, "They have taken the Lord from the Tomb." Imagine what ran through their minds—where did they take him? Why did they move his body? Now what?

Imagine that first encounter in the upper room. Is it really you, Lord? You were dead. They crucified you. We buried you. Now you are here ... is this a dream?

Imagine the skepticism and doubt of the early disciples who didn't see the resurrected Jesus, but who were his followers and knew the Apostles. How is this possible? You are asking me to believe the unbelievable!

Two thousand years later, many of these same feelings and questions persist—we're scared; we don't understand; we doubt. Where are you, God? Why is this happening? How is this possible?

Fortunately, we have the eyewitness testimony recorded for us in sacred Scripture. We have the history, tradition and teachings of the Church. We have the wisdom of Saints to guide, help and inspire us. While it must have been simultaneously awesome, confusing and scary to be an early disciple of Jesus, we have many tools they didn't to encounter the resurrected Christ through experiences like imaginative prayer, known to many as Lectio Divina.

We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your resurrection. Meanwhile, we wait in joyful hope, for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Imagine how awesome that will be!

Oración imaginativa

¿Alguna vez te imaginas presente en una historia del Evangelio? ¿Alguna vez has pensado en lo que habrías dicho o hecho si estuvieras allí? ¿Alguna vez te has preguntado cómo fueron esos primeros días y semanas después de la Resurrección?

Una forma de oración es la oración imaginativa. Comienzas leyendo un pasaje de las Escrituras en forma lenta y deliberada, prestando atención a los detalles. Puedes leerlo por segunda vez. Luego, cierra los ojos y reproduce la historia en tu mente, imaginándote presente como un espectador o un personaje en particular.

Piensa en los acontecimientos de Semana Santa e inmediatamente después de Pascua...

Imagina ver a tu amigo, maestro y salvador arrestado, golpeado y brutalmente asesinado el Viernes Santo. A pesar de que les dijeron lo que sucedería, todavía no entendían. ¿Qué estaban pensando los Apóstoles?

Imagínate el miedo, la culpa, la ira y la tristeza que deben haber sentido. ¿Cómo procesaron estas emociones?

Imagina ver a tu amigo, maestro y salvador arrestado, golpeado y brutalmente asesinado el Viernes Santo. A pesar de que les dijeron lo que sucedería, todavía no entendían. ¿Qué estaban pensando los Apóstoles?

Imagina ese primer encuentro en el aposento alto. ¿Eres realmente tú, Señor? estabas muerto, Te crucificaron. Te enterramos. Ahora estás aquí... ¿es esto un sueño?

Imaginate el escepticismo y la duda de los primeros discípulos que no vieron a Jesús resucitado, pero que eran sus seguidores y conocían a los Apóstoles. ¿Cómo es esto posible? iMe estás pidiendo que crea lo increíble!

Dos mil años después, muchos de estos mismos sentimientos y preguntas persisten: tenemos miedo; no entendemos; dudamos ¿Dónde estás, Dios? ¿Por qué está pasando esto? ¿Cómo es esto posible?

Afortunadamente, tenemos el testimonio de testigos oculares registrado para nosotros en las Sagradas Escrituras. Tenemos la historia, la tradición y las enseñanzas de la Iglesia. Tenemos la sabiduría de los Santos para guiarnos, ayudarnos e inspirarnos. Si bien debe haber sido a la vez asombroso, confuso y aterrador ser uno de los primeros discípulos de Jesús, tenemos muchas herramientas que ellos no tenían para encontrarse con el Cristo resucitado a través de experiencias como la oración imaginativa, conocida para muchos como Lectio Divina.

Proclamamos tu muerte, oh, Señor, y profesamos tu resurrección. Mientras tanto, esperamos con gozosa esperanza la venida de nuestro salvador, Jesucristo. ilmagina lo increíble que será!







Top Misconceptions About Life Insurance



The Life Insurance Research and Marketing Association's 2022 Life Insurance Barometer Study tracks consumer financial trends. The study revealed four widely held misconceptions that keep Americans from achieving the financial security that life insurance can provide.

Misconception 1: Life Insurance is Too Expensive

More than half of Americans **overestimate** the cost of life insurance by as much as **threefold**. This is especially true for younger generations.

The cost of term life insurance for a healthy 30-year-old is around \$15 per month.³ Yet, 44% of Millennials estimate it to be more than **Six times** higher—at a costly \$95 per month.

This misperception about cost, coupled with prioritizing other financial needs, puts families **needlessly** at risk of financial hardship should a wage earner die unexpectedly.

Misconception 2: My Workplace Life Insurance is Enough

29% of American workers believe the coverage they get through work is enough.

The median life insurance coverage offered at the workplace is either a flat sum of \$20,000 or one year's salary. More than half of U.S. households (54%) rely on dual incomes, and for many, losing one income could be devastating to the households' finances.

According to the survey, 42% of families would face financial hardship within six months, and 25% would suffer financially within a month.

Misconception 3: It is Too Difficult to Buy Life Insurance

Nearly half of Americans (46%) say they have put off purchasing the coverage they know they need. This could be, in part, because they are intimidated by the process.

The pandemic has accelerated the adoption of simplified underwriting. 48% of consumers say they are more likely to buy life insuring using simplified underwriting.

Misconception 4: I Don't Need Life Insurance Until I Am Older

Younger consumers who do not yet have a spouse/partner or dependents may believe they can put off buying life insurance. In reality, life insurance is significantly less expensive for the young and healthy. Buying a policy can protect their financial future and the financial security of their loved ones.

Nearly 4 in 10 insured consumers wish they had purchased their policies at a younger age.

Principales creencias erróneas sobre los seguros de vida

El estudio anual "Barómetro de seguros de vida" de Life Insurance Marketing and Research Association sigue las percepciones, actitudes y conductas financieras de los consumidores adultos. Se identificaron cuatro conceptos erróneos comunes que impiden que los estadounidenses obtengan la seguridad financiera que un seguro de vida puede proveer.

Creencia errónea 1: El seguro de vida es demasiado costoso

Más de la mitad de los estadounidenses **Sobreestiman** el costo de un seguro de vida hasta **el triple**. Esto ocurre principalmente en las generaciones más jóvenes.

El costo de un seguro de vida a término para una persona saludable de 30 años de edad es de alrededor de \$15 cada mes. Sin embargo, el 44% de los *millennials* estiman que cuesta más de **Seis Veces** más; a un precio muy elevado de hasta \$95 mensual.

Esta percepción errónea sobre el costo, aunada a dar prioridad a otras necesidades financieras, genera **riesgos innecesarios** de que las familias sufran problemas financieros en caso de que el sostén del hogar fallezca inesperadamente.

Creencia errónea 2: El seguro de vida de mi trabajo es suficiente

El 29% de los trabajadores estadounidenses piensan que la cobertura que reciben en su trabajo es suficiente.

La cobertura de seguro de vida mediana ofrecida en el trabajo es una suma fija de \$20,000 o un año de salario. 1 Más de la mitad de los hogares estadounidenses (54%) reciben dos ingresos, y para muchos de ellos perder un ingreso podría ser devastador para las finanzas familiares.

De acuerdo con la encuesta, el 42% de las familias tendrían problemas financieros antes de seis meses, y 25% tendrían problemas financieros en menos de un mes.

Creencia errónea 3: Es demasiado difícil contratar un seguro de vida

Casi **la mitad de los estadounidenses (46%)** dicen que han pospuesto la contratación de la cobertura que saben que necesitan. Esto podría deberse, en parte, a que el proceso los intimida.

La pandemia ha acelerado la adopción de suscripciones simplificadas. El 48% de los consumidores dicen que es más probable que contraten un seguro de vida usando la suscripción simplificada.

Creencia errónea 4: No necesito un seguro de vida hasta que sea más viejo

Los consumidores más jóvenes que aún no tienen un cónyuge/pareja o dependientes pueden creer que les conviene posponer la contratación de un seguro de vida. En realidad, el seguro de vida es notablemente menos costoso para las personas jóvenes y saludables. Contratar una póliza puede proteger a su futuro financiero y a la seguridad financiera de sus seres queridos.

Casi 4 de cada 10 consumidores asegurados desearían haber contratado sus pólizas cuando eran más jóvenes.

Unique Care for Special Needs: Meet the Mette Family

Catholic Financial Life conducts our business with a "Main Street, not Wall Street" approach, serving our members on a community level through all of life's seasons. Caring for our members with special needs remains a crucial element of our mission, and allows us to be a part of some of our members' most life-altering moments. Catholic Financial Life members Michelle and Michael Mette reflect on how Catholic Financial Life supported them through their daughter's diagnosis.

Members since 2012, Michelle and Michael tour the nation with their eight children as Mette Family Ministries. When their children were born, Michelle and Michael purchased a Catholic Financial Life insurance policy for each child; all of the family members are Catholic Financial Life members. While most of the Mette children's policies look similar, one of the daughters, Fidelity, is an exception.

Serving Those with Special Needs

When Fidelity was born, she was diagnosed with Prader-Willi syndrome, a genetic condition that impacts her metabolism, feeding and overall development. After Fidelity's diagnosis, the Mette family discovered new ways that Catholic Financial Life would stay by their side as they walked this path.

After Michelle brought Fidelity home from the NICU, she evaluated her options for Catholic Financial Life insurance, and worried that her daughter may not qualify for coverage.

"I sent an email and said, 'I know this is a long-shot and explained Fidelity's condition." She got a response back
